Dear Parents & Carers,

We have had an increasing number of families impacted by covid currently, we keep you all in our prayers for a full and speedy recovery. If we can help in any way please contact school and we will try our best to support you. If a member of the household tests positive for covid, the children can still come to school if they do not have any symptoms and have tested negative on a lateral flow test. **You must please continue to test your children for 7 full days on lateral flow tests** to ensure they remain negative and to prevent covid being brought into school by children who are asymptomatic (covid positive but don't show any symptoms). If your child shows symptoms and tests positive on a lateral flow test they must isolate at home for at least 7 days until well.

Thank you for working with us to keep everyone safe.

Attendance

Our Education Welfare Officer, Mrs Bradshaw, monitors attendance daily and continues to make home visits to support parents to ensure their child attends school regularly and on time.

Please remember that as a parent/carer you must provide school with a reason for any absences or time needed out of school and provide school with a copy of any official paperwork related to the absence e.g. for medical appointments, legal appointments, etc. It is also academy policy that you complete a leave of absence request form in advance of any planned absences e.g. to celebrate a significant faith event e.g. Eid, or for legal appointments. Without this paperwork your child's absence will be recorded as unauthorised and will therefore impact on their overall attendance and could result in a fine or legal action. This has always been academy policy and the vast majority of parents/carers do always provide this in advance of any appointments.

Taking holidays in school time is not allowed and will result in you being fined by the local authority. Fines are significant and are issued for each parent for each child in the family.

We want to work with you to ensure continuous regular attendance and good punctuality and if you need support with this please let us know. Poor attendance or punctuality significantly impacts on children's education and they have already had so much time out of school as a result of covid.

CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

I am very aware of the increase in covid infection rates over the Christmas period and have been contacted by a number of parents who have recently had or who have now contracted covid. They are all being extremely safe and taking protective measures to restrict the transmission of the virus and keeping us well informedthank you and we wish you all well for a speedy and full recovery.

With this in mind, please do be aware that the virus is still with us and watch out for any symptoms in yourself or your children. We will contact you to collect your child if we see any symptoms and ask you to take them for a PCR test or isolate for the 7-10 day period. Please do not get angry with school staff if you are contacted as this is something we have to do to keep the school community safe and is a legal obligation we must fulfil. I know it is difficult particularly for working parents to be called to collect their child and we will only do this if a child is presenting with symptoms e.g. a new or persistent cough or feels or complains of being hot to the touch. We understand that there are also a lot of other colds, coughs and flu symptoms around but we do have to follow government ruling.

Thank you for cooperating with us to keep everyone as safe as possible as we do not want to return to whole school and class closures as remote learning is not the best for the children and put additional pressure on parents to support their children at home with lessons.

School Uniform

We have had a number of children return form the Christmas break wearing trainers instead of school shoes. Many children have grown out of their shoes over the break which is understandable or couldn't find their shoes in time for school this morning. Please make sure your child is now in full school uniform including plain black school shoes.

PE KIT UNIFORM

PE Kits can be worn to school on PE days: **Monday:** Year 1 and 2 **Tuesday:** year 1, 2 and 4 will have an additional PE lesson until 11th Feb

Wednesday: Year 3, 4, 5 & 6

Friday: Reception

Thursday: Year 3 will be swimming so will need to bring their swimming kit in a bag with a towel each week on Thursdays from 6th Jan-10th Feb.

PE Kit is part of our school uniform so children must have the correct kit:

- Plain black hoody and joggers, **no logos**, **no leggings** please, this can be bought at any shop/supplier/online.
- School white T Shirt and green shorts from the school supplier.

After School Care

After school clubs now run until 5.30pm Monday-Thursday. If there is enough demand, club will start on Fridays, please let TB Sports know if this something you would like.

The TB Sport Team are fantastic and the numbers are growing, particularly in breakfast club. They are working with us to listen to you views and have increased their hours as a result. SEESAW CODES

Please check your child's seesaw code works and if you are having any difficulties, please speak to your child's class teacher for help. In the event of your child needing to isolate due to covid or school closure you will need to access home learning via seesaw.

Your child should be accessing seesaw each week to complete their homework unless you have requested homework be given in a paper format.

World Book Day Thurs 3rd March 2022

They will be invited to come to school dressed as their favourite book character and we will have a catwalk show which hopefully we will be able to invite you to join us for. SYNOD 2023

Earlier this year, Bishop Patrick wrote to all Catholic Schools and parishes and asked for their views on the following questions as part of a time of listening. The Synodal Process is not about a democratic debate. It is place of respectful mutual listening and experiencing the call of the Holy Spirit to move in new ways:

- Who are the people who feel left out and excluded in the church? How can we reach out, listen to and love them?
- What is my dream for the church and my school? How can we make this happen?
- What does the Holy Spirit inspire us to do in our Church and school? What do you think the Holy Spirit is calling us to do next?

The Solemnity of the Epiphany: a special blessing for your home The church has a custom of blessing homes on the Feast of the Epiphany and the weeks following. It is an invitation to Jesus to be a daily guest in our homes and to bless those who or live or visit our homes.

A traditional way of doing this is to use chalk blessed at mass today and write above the home's doorway: 20+C+M+B+22

The letters C, M, B have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar. They also abbreviate the Latin words Christus mansionem benedicat- 'May Christ bless this house'. The '+' signs represent the cross and

2022 is the year. In school, each class has followed this tradition in asking for God's blessing on their classroom and those inside it and some children asked if they could follow this tradition at home. We are offering this to all families in case you may want to join in.

Instructions for Blessing Your Home

This week we will send each family a small piece of blessed chalk and the prayer to accompany the action of the blessing. Use the blessed chalk and mark the lintel above your front door (or front door step) as follows- 20+C+M+B+22 saying: The three Wise Men, Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar followed the start of God's son who became human two thousand and twenty two years ago. May Christ bless our home and remain with us throughout this year.

Then say this prayer...

Visit, O blessed Lord, this home with the joy of your presence. Bless all who live or visit here with the gift of your love and grant that we may share your love with each other and to all whose lives we touch. May we grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of you: guide, comfort and strengthen us in peace, O Jesus Christ, now and forever. Amen

Coronavirus Symptomatic Pupils and Household Members

If you or your child develops coronavirus symptoms: a high temperature, a new or continuous cough, loss or change of sense of smell or taste please take the following advice.

- Symptomatic person must self-isolate and take a lateral flow test. Until further notice, you no longer need to book a confirmation PCR test.
- Please let school know if you, your child or anyone in your household has tested positive using a lateral flow test.
- If a person **tests positive** for COVID-19, they must self-isolate for 7 days from the day after the positive result. On day 6 and 24 hours later on day 7 if you take two lateral flow tests (one on each day 24 hours apart) and each test is negative you can now return to school if well enough and they no longer have a temperature.
- Other household members or close contacts of a person who has tested positive for covid do not need to isolate if they
 have had both vaccinations or are under 18 years and 6months old unless they are symptomatic in which case they
 should take a lateral flow test.

Booking a Test:

- If you can't get hold of any lateral flow tests you can still book a PCR test
- If parents struggle to use the internet or don't have internet access they can 119 for help in booking a test.

Nursery Places

If you would like a place for your child in our amazing nursery, please collect and complete an application form from the school office. Morning places are free for all 3 and 4 year olds receiving a 15 hours codes and free all day places are available for those eligible for the 30 hours code. You must apply now for a code. We also offer full day places to all children if parents would like to pay for afternoon sessions and top up their free 15 hours places. The cost will be £77 per week paid in advance via online payments. Please contact the office or Mrs Sarno if this is something you'd be interested in.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS APPLICATIONS

We know that many parents may be entitled to claim Free School Meals but don't apply especially if their children are in EYFS or KS 1.

Please do make an application for free school meals as school will receive additional funding for your child which will greatly help to provide extra resources.
