Attendance

Our Education Welfare Officer, Mrs Bradshaw, monitors attendance daily and continues to make home visits to support parents to ensure their child attends school regularly and on time.

Please remember that as a parent/carer you must provide school with a reason for any absences or time needed out of school and provide school with a copy of any official paperwork related to the absence e.g. for medical appointments, legal appointments, etc. It is also academy policy that you complete a leave of absence request form in advance of any planned absences e.g. to celebrate a significant faith event e.g. Eid, or for legal appointments. Without this paperwork your child's absence will be recorded as unauthorised and will therefore impact on their overall attendance and could result in a fine or legal action. This has always been academy policy and the vast majority of parents/carers do always provide this in advance of any appointments.

Taking holidays in school time is not allowed and will result in you being fined by the local authority.

Fines are significant and are issued for each parent for each child in the family.

We want to work with you to ensure continuous regular attendance and good punctuality and if you need support with this please let us know. Poor attendance or punctuality significantly impacts on children's education and they have already had so much time out of school as a result of covid.

Message from Mrs Bradshaw: Punctuality has dipped a little this week, I know the mornings are becoming darker but remember to set that alarm!

Nottingham Cathedral Carol Service

This year, Year 4 & 5 are involved in Cathedral Choir sessions each week with Gregory Treloar, the choir master from the cathedral. It has been absolutely fantastic to see how much they have enjoyed these weekly choir sessions. The children have been invited to take part in the cathedral carol service on Wednesday 8th December which we are very excited about and is a great opportunity for the children. Miss Lane, Mrs Cannell and I will take the children to the cathedral for a 2.30pm rehearsal. The carol service will begin at 6pm and parents are invited to attend. PANTS Programme EYFS & KS 1

In our PSHE lessons next half term, we will be discussing the NSPCC's Underwear Rule. This is designed to teach pupils how to stay safe from sexual abuse, without giving explicit information or telling scary stories or even using the term "sexual abuse."

In the lessons, children will learn about the 'PANTS' acrostic, which stands for:

- Privates are private
- Always remember your body belongs to you
- No means no
- Talk about secrets that upset you
- Speak up, someone can help

The lessons will be delivered in a way that's fully age-appropriate.

Peer-on-peer abuse includes, but is not limited to:

- -physical and sexual abuse.
- -sexual harassment and violence.
- -emotional harm.
- -on and offline bullying.
- -teenage relationship abuse

Peer-on-peer sexual abuse is sexual abuse that happens between children of a similar age or stage of development. It can happen between any number of children, and can affect any age group.

It can be harmful to the children who display it as well as those who experience it.



- -at school
- -at home or in someone else's home
- -in public spaces
- -online

This week we will be working with the children to educate them in an age appropriate way to:

- -know what peer on peer abuse is,
- -know it is not tolerated in school or at home.
- -know what consent is,
- -give them the language and confidence to say no to peer on peer abuse,
- -know who they can tell if they experience peer on peer abuse,
- -know that they will be believed, listened to and helped.

Break Time Snacks

Children in early years and KS 1 are provided with fruit each day as a healthy mid-morning snack.

Children in KS 2 are welcome to bring a snack for break time but **this must be a healthy snack** e.g. a piece of fruit, oat based breakfast bar (not cereal based-rice krispie bar or anything containing traces of nuts.

Please don't bring biscuits, chocolate, sweets, crisps, muffins, cereal bars or anything high in sugar or fats as a snack please. If your child brings anything other than fruit or oat based breakfast bar, we will send the item home with them.

Secondary School Applications

If you have a child in year 6 please be aware that you need to complete your application for their secondary school by **31st October.** This should be done online via the admissions portal.

A few points to remember:

- Always apply to more than one school
- List the schools in order of preference
- If applying to a faith school, also submit a supplementary form which can be accessed on the website of the school you are applying to.
- For a faith school include a baptism certificate.



Coronavirus Symptomatic Pupils

If you or your child develops coronavirus symptoms: a high temperature, a new or continuous cough, loss or change of sense of smell or taste please take the following advice.

- Symptomatic person must self-isolate and book a PCR test.
- Book a test for the child/parent and please let school know the results as soon as you have them.
- If the child/parent **tests negative** and are well, have no symptoms, they can stop isolating and return to school.
- If a person **tests positive** for COVID-19, they must self-isolate for 10 days and return to school only when well enough and they no longer have a temperature.
- The household do not need to isolate if they have had both vaccinations or are under 18 years and 6months old unless they are symptomatic in which case they should take a PCR test at a test centre.

Booking a Test:

- If parents struggle to use the internet or don't have internet access they can 119 for help in booking a
 test.
- Contact https://111.nhs.uk/COVID-19 or call 111 if at any point symptoms get worse

Nursery Places

If you would like a place for your child in our amazing nursery, please collect and complete an application form from the school office. Morning places are free for all 3 and 4 year olds receiving a 15 hours codes and free all day places are available for those eligible for the 30 hours code. You must apply now for a code. We also offer full day places to all children if parents would like to pay for afternoon sessions and top up their free 15 hours places. The cost will be £77 per week paid in advance via online payments. Please contact the office or Mrs Sarno if this is something you'd be interested in.

Breakfast & After School Clubs

TB Sports provide breakfast and after school clubs in school daily. Breakfast club begins from 7.30-8.45am after which the children are taken to class.

After school clubs run from the end of the school day until 5pm.
