Attendance

Our Education Welfare Officer, Mrs Bradshaw, monitors attendance daily and continues to make home visits to support parents to ensure their child attends school regularly and on time.

Please remember that as a parent/carer you must provide school with a reason for any absences or time needed out of school and provide school with a copy of any official paperwork related to the absence e.g. for medical appointments, legal appointments, etc. It is also academy policy that you complete a leave of absence request form in advance of any planned absences e.g. to celebrate a significant faith event e.g. Eid, or for legal appointments. Without this paperwork your child's absence will be recorded as unauthorised and will therefore impact on their overall attendance and could result in a fine or legal action. This has always been academy policy and the vast majority of parents/carers do always provide this in advance of any appointments.

Taking holidays in school time is not allowed and will result in you being fined by the local authority.

Fines are significant and are issued for each parent for each child in the family.

We want to work with you to ensure continuous regular attendance and good punctuality and if you need support with this please let us know. Poor attendance or punctuality significantly impacts on children's education and they have already had so much time out of school as a result of covid.

Message from Mrs Bradshaw:

I hope you all had a lovely holiday and all are ready for a new school term of good attendance and punctuality. Despite a nasty sickness bug, which hit many city schools, St Patrick's whole school

attendance remained very good-over 95% for the whole school-well done! We aim for 97% as this is the government expectation and what you need to achieve in your lessons so let's stay healthy and stay in school.

However, we are having an increasing number of children arriving in school with juice, tea and other drinks in their bottles.

The idea behind this initiative is that children drink water so please ensure that only water is in their bottles so that

we can continue to agree to children

bringing their own bottles as requested.

Coronavirus Symptomatic Pupils and Household Members

The government has released updated guidance for schools, which takes effect from Friday 1 April 2022. The key messages are listed here:

- adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature
- children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend
- adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days

Key Message for parents and Carers:

If your child has symptoms of Covid-19 **and** has a high temperature, they should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They should only return to school when they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to return.

I know that many of you are disappointed that COVID-19 is still impacting on life, but it is important that we all follow these guidelines, for the safety and well-being of everyone in the school and wider communities.

We know that many parents may be entitled to claim Free School Meals but don't apply especially if their children are in EYFS or KS 1.

E-SAFETY UPDATE FROM MISS LANE

This week-Setting Parental Controls on Games Consoles

This week's e-safety update is all about setting up parental control on games consoles. Many children in school own a games console and as the children are the 'experts' of these devices parents are often unsure how to limit or restrict inappropriate content. Please read the information below to see how you can add parental controls to your child's game console.

Xbox

Download the Xbox Family Settings app. Download the app via the Apple app store or Google Play. This app can be used on iPhones, iPads, and androids.

"Game time now comes with more peace of mind with the Xbox Family Settings app. Easily manage your children's activities on Xbox consoles and enable gaming options that are right for your family. Quickly get into the fun by adding your children to your family account. Set screen time, update content restrictions, prevent children from making accidental purchases, and stay on top of incoming friend requests all in real time."

Playstation

In order to use the PlayStation Network Safety Settings, you must be over 18. Once you have created an account for yourself, you can then create sub-accounts on the Play Station Network for your children, which are then linked to your own account. This enables you to have full control over the various Parental Restrictions which can be placed on this sub-account, restricting how you child can interact across on the PlayStation platform and range of products.

Including:

- Removal of chat function
- Prevent internet browsing
- Removal of in app purchases

How to set up a Playstation account

- Enter this link into a phone/laptop/tablet https://www.playstation.com, scroll down the webpage and click on **Join Now**. Enter your details as required to create a new account.
- If you already have a PlayStation Network Account, log in by selecting Sign in to PSN
- Once signed to your account select the Account Settings tab which is under the Profile Picture and confirm your log in details.
- Select the Family Management option from the menu
- You will see your own account on the right of the screen listed as Family Manager
- You can also now add your children's account, if they have an existing PlayStation Network
 Account or create a new account for them by selecting the Add Family Member option
