Time To Talk Day!

On Thursday the 2nd of February, we will celebrate **Time to Talk Day** which is organised by the mental health charity 'Mind' and 'Rethink Mental Illness.'

The purpose of this day is to draw attention to mental health and the importance of reaching out to others. The day aims to help people open up and be honest about mental health, without the fear and stigma often attached to the topic.
