## Year 6 Residential



This is in line with the charity called Voice 21 who work with schools to ensure dedicated Oracy work in schools to support

education in all aspects. We are engaging with research around

what it means to speak well and with confidence in a range of

settings and develop vocabulary as a result.

It is our aim that the children at St Patrick' school are confident speakers who know their ideas and opinions matter and are heard. We are working to ensure all the children are aware of positive speaking behaviours such as eye contact, articulation and voice projection to ensure their views are clearly heard by their class, their peers in their secondary school when they leave St Patrick's and beyond this as they embark on the world of work in their future. This focus very much feeds into all aspect of life for our children now and in the future when they are preparing for presentations or preparing for interviews for future employment. It works hand in hand with our mission statement of 'learning for life.'

We've used the acronym **SHAPE** to remind the children of confident, clear speaking with the by-line of 'Be loud and proud!' Your child should be able to tell you all about it and even 'shape' their answer!
