St Patrick's Catholic School has been at its current site since 1963, but has its origins dating back in Nottingham from the 19th century.

It has always been a popular school with a family atmosphere anwd an excellent reputation for attainment, behaviour and politeness.

Innovative and effective learning and teaching strategies are core and school leaders use current research to inform decisions ensuring an effective curriculum.

We have a vibrant, inspiring, dynamic and technological learning environment. It is child-centred and inspires independence.

Learning takes place in a range of settings in and around the school grounds, from the bright, learning centred classrooms, wellresourced inviting library, to our extensive rural outdoor area. This includes a Forest School site, sports pitches, mini orchards, trim trails, adventures playgrounds, reading areas and the creative child-led EYFS outdoor learning area.

The design of all classrooms provides direct safe access to outdoor learning opportunities providing for the differing learning styles and needs of all pupils.

Our curriculum

We strive to offer the very best for all pupils and are proud of our thematic, topic-based and varied curriculum. Each subject has been planned to ensure continuous learning so that pupils are always deepening their understanding and acquiring and retaining new knowledge.

In addition to high quality classroom teaching in all subjects, we also have subject specialist providers who teach French, music and PE to ensure pupils acquire the very best wider curriculum knowledge.

Our curriculum is enhanced through additional opportunities to engage in individual and group activities. These include:

- Instrumental music tuition
- Singing coaching, school and cathedral choir
- Engagement in achieving national awards
- Parish and community work
- Sporting events and competitions
- Trips, visits and inspirational visitors.

Teaching and learning

Our teachers ensure that every lesson is planned so that pupils can be challenged and supported whatever their ability. Teachers track pupils' progress carefully and use this to inform their day-to-day and medium-term planning.

Every class is supported by a teaching assistant who provides small group and individual support and challenge. They also deliver daily 'subject surgeries' for pupils who may not have fully understood the concept taught in the lesson – to secure understanding and prepare them for the new learning in the next lesson.







Collective and personal prayer is at the centre of school life and is part of every school day.

We aim to educate, promote and support each individual's journey of faith by bringing the Gospel values and the teaching of the Catholic Church into every aspect of school life.

Catholic social teaching and teaching of British values are important elements of our curriculum and ethos.

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Beyond the curriculum

At St Patrick's, we value the uniqueness of all our pupils and establish an ethos that develops the 'whole child'.

Our pupils are encouraged to take risks and build resilience. They are encouraged to be inquisitive lifelong learners who question and explore the world around them.

Our nurturing staff recognise and support a diversity of needs relating to learning, health, mental wellbeing, behaviour as well as emotional and physical requirements ensuring that all our pupils feel safe, secure and are able to aspire to be the very best they can be.

Enrichment activities

The extensive range of extra-curricular activities offered to pupils continues to be a real success of our school. Our pupils have the opportunity to take part in a range of activities across the school year at lunchtimes and after school including ECO club, dance, gymnastics, basketball, didi rugby, maths and football. Forest Schools

All pupils have an opportunity every year to engage with the Forest Schools programme at an age appropriate level as they move through school. Forest Schools is a child-centred inspirational learning process. It is a long-term programme that supports play, exploration and supported risk taking. It develops confidence and self-esteem through learner inspired, hands-on experiences in our beautiful natural and extensive outdoor learning environment.

Sporting activities

Our pupils take part in a wide range of sports both within the curriculum, and through extra-curricular clubs. We recognise that sport should be enjoyed by children at every level, but we also appreciate the value of nurturing a natural and friendly competitive spirit in our pupils. We aim for every pupil to experience pride in representing the school at some point during their time at St Patrick's.

After School Club

Our before and after school clubs are for pupils in reception to year 6, run on site by TB Sports, an OFSTED registered independent childcare company. Breakfast club runs from 7.30am–8.45am providing a variety of healthy breakfast options and extensive range of child and adult led play and sports activities. After school club runs from 3.15pm–5.30pm. Sessions can be used daily for before or after school care or both or as the need arises.

Opportunities for personal development

During their time at St Patrick's our pupils are provided with a wide range of opportunities to develop their knowledge and skills in becoming a young leader and team member who make a valuable contribution to the school, parish, local and wider community.

We aim for them to be able to lead, cooperate, persevere, have a voice, show responsibility, resilience, determination and respect.

This is very strong aspect of the Catholic life of our school. We strongly encourage pupils to take up at least one these opportunities for personal development:

- a mini class chaplain (all classes)
- a pupil voice member (Year 1 to Year 6)
- an altar server (for pupils who have made the First Holy Communion)
- an ECO Warrior (Year 3 & 4)
- a young sports leader (Year 5)
- a member of the chaplaincy team (Year 5)
- Faith in Action Award (Year 5)
- a house captain (Year 6)
- a librarian (Year 6)



Working with parents/carers

At St Patrick's we greatly value working with parents/carers and respect and appreciate your opinions and contribution to continuing school development so that we can provide our pupils with the best possible education.

We passionately believe in a strong and positive partnership between pupil, parent and school. We believe that good communication between parents/ carers and school is vital for pupils to succeed.

Before starting school in reception year, there will be an opportunity for new pupils to visit their class and parents/carers to attend an information meeting where they can ask any questions they may have.

If a child starts mid-year, there is an opportunity to meet the headteacher or senior leader to share information about their child, ask guestions, look around school and meet their teacher. We want our parents/carers to feel as happy, secure and well informed as possible when handing over their child to us. We believe It is a privilege to care for and educate parents/carers' children.

Joining St Patrick's

You are warmly invited to visit our school and see the children involved in their learning; this can be arranged by calling the school office and making an appointment.

Children can join Nursery as soon as possible after they turn three provided we have a space available. Children join Reception, in the September after they turn four.
