This week we celebrated the school's 60th birthday! We enjoyed a beautiful Mass celebration led by Bishop Patrick himself who spoke to the children about Saint Patrick and what it means to be a saint. The children excelled themselves with their answers and it was clear they enjoyed the celebration as their singing raised the roof! We were joined by all members of our school community including Trust and Diocesan representatives, past pupils from The Becket school, parent/carers, parishioners from Our Lady and St Patrick's Church, Governors and staff members, past and present. It was wonderful to welcome so many visitors who have played such an important part in the growth, life and joy of the school.

We were even more delighted to hear that Bishop Patrick was able to stay to bless our brand, new **Community Prayer Garden**. The blessing was a truly beautiful occasion with the sun shining and the birds singing. This garden will be officially open after half term once the grass has had time to settle. Huge thanks to Mr Etches and the Trust site for their hard work with this – it truly was a work of heart! The sculptures were designed by the children themselves to represent our mission statement with the red heart to symbolise *love first*, the green cross links to St Patrick and the multi-panel glass represents our diverse, multi-cultural community.



In true celebratory style, we extended the celebrations for the entire week! So far the children have enjoyed a range of activities including a 'Journey through the decades' Hymn Practice.

Today, the school was alive with all kinds of bright and bold colours inspired by the 60s! Mrs Cannell launched the **'60 Acts in 60 Days'** challenge to encourage the children to do one small act of kindness every day for 60 days. The children will also take home a commemorative book mark today to remember this special day and our mission statement of, *'With Jesus we love first, live the Gospels and learn for life.'*
