**RSHE CURRICULUM – TenTen Life to Full**

Dear Parents/ Carers,

Please find below details of information previously sent to parents regarding the delivery of the RSE Curriculum in school. In addition to this letter, you will receive further information from your child's class teacher regarding delivery of topics deemed of a 'sensitive' nature, as they taught across the school year.

As you will be aware, at St Patrick's pupils are taught the PSHE and statutory RSE Curriculum using the programme - Life to the Full by TenTen. Details of the programme can be found on the **school website** or using the following link <https://www.tentenresources.co.uk/parent-portal/life-to-the-full-plus/> (I have attached a QR code at the top of this letter to support with accessing the resources). Should you be asked to enter a username or password the details are as follows:

**PASSWORD:** glass-of-water

Central to our work in school, is learning about our faith, including understanding ourselves, our position in our community and how we develop as human beings. This is supported by resources provided by TenTen Life to the Full Plus.

Content is age and stage appropriate and is taught with sensitivity, taking into account the children's level of maturity in regard to the delivery of the sessions. As with all aspects of learning, children are naturally curious and many will have specific questions related to their sessions. Opportunities to discuss questions form part of the sessions and, again, these are treated with care and understanding.

The RSE programme is delivered by your child's class teacher. We do hope that all children will participate in the RSE programme, however, parents do have the right to withdraw their child from all or part of the RSE sessions that do not form part of the statutory National Curriculum. If you wish to discuss this further please do speak to your class teacher or member of the Senior Leadership team.
