As we come to the end of our Advent term, there are lots of items to share with you and celebrate before the holiday ahead.

#### **Advent Mass**

At the start of December, we gathered to celebrate the start of Advent in Mass. It was wonderful to celebrate this special season together in prayer and song. So far, the children have helped with our Advent preparation wonderfully in a range of ways:

EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2 Nativity – The children shone with confidence and joy as they performed such a heart-felt interpretation of the Christmas story! It was wonderful to celebrate our youngest children coming together to retell the Christmas story in a way that spread light, hope, Christmas cheer whilst reflecting on the true meaning of Christmas.

**Year 3 HOPE Celebration of the Word** – A beautiful start to our weekly preparations. The children sang with spirit and spoke clearly, reminding us about the hope of kinder world as we near to Christmas time.

**Year 4 PEACE Celebration of the Word** – Year 4 led us in prayer to reflect on the theme of peace. Whilst it provided us with moments of calm and reflection, the children raised the roof with their singing, spreading peace and positivity far and wide!

Year 5 JOY Celebration of the Word – Year 5 certainly brought the joy and led us confidently in reflecting on the joy of Christmas and how we can appreciate and spread this to others in the simplest of actions from the guiet of the snow to the laughter in classrooms.

Year 6 LOVE - Year 6 ended our Advent reflections this week with a poignant and powerful reflection on how we can show love to ourselves and others at Christmas time.

#### **Parish-School Links**

We have continued to strengthen our links with Our Lady and St Patrick's Church this term with every class having visited the Church for Mass. A number of children have also represented the school at Church when reading the bidding prayers for a range of Masses including Education Sunday and the feast of Christ The King. # **Fundraising and Serving Others**

We have held a number of fundraising events recently where lots of money has been raised to help those in need. Our Year 6 Faith In Action Team, along with Debbie our school chef, put their baking skills to work when making and decorating cookies to raise £35 for the Sickle Cell Society.

Mrs Foote's famous Snowman Sacks raised a whopping £250! Every class has been given a portion of this money to choose and spend on CAFOD gifts in order to help children and families overseas in a variety of ways. #### PFA


