As we come to the end of the first half of the Lent term, there are lots of items to share with you and celebrate before the half-term holiday ahead.

Start of Year Mass

At the start of January, we gathered to celebrate the start of the Lent term and the Epiphany in Mass. It was wonderful to celebrate this special feast day together in prayer and song with parents, parishioners and Governors. The children sang beautifully and we used the celebration to launch the *Jubilee Pilgrims of Hope* as led by Pope Francis. The Jubilee Year is a landmark moment in the life of the global church. School communities are invited to join together as pilgrims of hope, pledging to work together for God's kingdom of justice, peace and love. At St Patrick's, we launched this special year in January by dressing up in our House team colours, donating money to CAFOD and making Pilgrim of Hope Prayer Pledges which are displayed in the school hall. We have a variety of themed events planned in for the year ahead including House charity events and the children have already learnt a special hymn linked to this year which we look forward to singing to you very soon. 
