The St Patrick's Reading Spine

In his book 'Reading Reconsidered', Doug Lemov points out that there are five types of texts that children should have access to in order to successfully navigate reading with confidence. These are complex and demand more from the reader than other types of books.

The five text types are:

Archaic Language

The vocabulary, usage, syntax and context for cultural reference of texts over 50 or 100 years old are vastly different and typically more complex than texts written today. The children need to be exposed to and develop proficiency with antiquated forms of expression to be able to read more complex texts.

Non-Linear Time Sequences

A story is narrated in a given style with a given rhythm but in the best books time moves in fits and starts. It doubles back, may include flashbacks, time travel, multiple plots happening at different times or the start of the book being the end result. These books enable children to restructure the events chronologically in their mind as they read.

Narratively Complex

Some books have multiple intertwined and apparently (for a time) unrelated plot lines, or different types of narrators. They may be told by a narrator who isn't aware of everything which happens in a story. Other books have non-human narrators such as the horse who tells the story in Black Beauty.

Figurative/Symbolic Text and Complexity of plot

Texts which can be interpreted to reveal a hidden meaning, typically a moral or political one. For example, Jiminy Cricket represents a conscience in 'Pinocchio'. These texts can also present more complicated plots which are interwoven throughout the narrative.

Resistant Texts

This refers to texts which are difficult to understand, texts that deliberately resist comprehension. You have to assemble meaning around nuances, hints, uncertainties and clues. Many poems also fall into this category.

Ofsted's English report (March, 2024) outlines "the choice of texts for English lessons should be based on literary merit."

The texts selected have been chosen with this in mind and to ensure all year groups cover the 5 Plagues of Reading. Furthermore, the texts are chosen to reflect the diversity of our children and enhanced through our in class diversity libraries.
