We do have a 'Welly Library' in school and always welcome donations. The spare wellingtons are free for your children to use. Please let school know if you need support in providing these for your children.



As children with wellington boots in school are able to access the field in all weather conditions, you may wish to send in **waterproof trousers or a waterproof suit** to protect your child's school uniform. Please send these in with your children if you wish for them to wear them whilst on the field. Children without wellingtons will still enjoy outdoor play on the concreted areas.

Labelled Uniform

Please ensure all **uniform items are labelled** with your child's name. This really does help with organisation and ensuring we are able to help your child look after their clothing.

Attendance

Regular and punctual attendance of pupils at school is not only vital for learning and development but a legal requirement. The national framework for penalty notices was launched last August 2024 and includes information regarding penalty notices for irregular attendance, such as the first-time penalty notice issued for term time leave of irregular attendance being £80 per parent, per child, if paid within 21 days. This framework is a requirement across the country and is followed by all schools. We appreciate that holidays are expensive out of term time however please note that this is national guidance and schools have a legal responsibility to follow it. Safe Parking – We need your help to keep our children safe outside of school

Councillor Linda Woodings, Executive member for Road Safety at Nottingham City Council has asked that the following message be shared with all parents/carers at the start of the academic year.

Sadly, over the last school year, three children were injured after being knocked over by cars outside Nottingham schools. As the new term begins, your co-operation in following the advice below is vital to keep the roads outside school calm and safe for everyone:

Be timely - Arrive to school in good time in order to park away from the school, especially the zig-zag lines and walk your child/children through the school gates. This will mean better visibility and a safer environment for everyone.

Be considerate - Park considerately without blocking pavements or resident's driveways and turn off your vehicle's engine whilst waiting, to reduce pollution

Be patient – Drive carefully and patiently whilst driving away from the school. We appreciate everyone has busy lives, however this has been the main cause of previous accidents.
