Year 6 Applications for Secondary School

The deadline for submitting your application for a secondary school place is 31 October 2025. Application forms are available on your home Local Authority website. For Catholic school applications, if you wish your child to be considered and ranked under a faith criterion you should also complete a supplementary information form and return this form to the school by the deadline (forms are available from the LA and the school). You **MUST** also include the supporting evidence* as required with this form, e.g. a baptismal certificate. Failure to supply the required supporting evidence may mean that your child is ranked in a lower criterion which may affect your chance of a place.

*If you do not have the required evidence please contact the parish where your child was baptised for a copy certificate in good time.

Please ensure all **uniform items are labelled** with your child's name including coats. This really does help with organisation and ensuring we are able to help your child look after their clothing.

Attendance

Regular and punctual attendance of pupils at school is not only vital for learning and development but a legal requirement. The national framework for penalty notices was launched in August 2024 and includes information regarding penalty notices for irregular attendance, such as the first-time penalty notice issued for term time leave or irregular attendance being £160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days. This framework is a requirement across the country and will be followed by all schools. We appreciate that holidays are expensive out of term time however please note that this is now national guidance and schools have a legal responsibility to follow it. Please take this new legislation into account when thinking about booking holidays during term time from September 2024.
