Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. Saint Peter is often considered the Apostle to the Jews and Saint Paul to the gentiles. Since the third century onwards, these two great saints' feast has been celebrated on this date in the Church. We know that St. Peter was the first pope and the head of the Apostles and St. Paul was the first great missionary of the Church. The grace of God was present in the lives of these two saints. Neither Peter nor Paul had straightforward paths to holiness. They were both apostles of Christ who sacrificed their lives to the same persecution.
