

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This Sunday is the second week of ordinary time in the liturgical year. In the gospel today we hear John the Baptist share his testimony about Jesus and what he has seen with his own eyes. Many times we Christians may make the mistake of talking only about morality or about the church, rather than sharing our faith effectively and our focus always being on Jesus. While the morality and teachings of the church are important parts of our belief, the core of our faith rests on Jesus. Once we see how fulfilling our life can be when we have a relationship with Jesus, then other beliefs begin to make sense. Then it may lead us to know how empty the way of the world is.

We are invited to share our faith in Jesus who has changed our lives. It may be uncomfortable at first to share our *Narratio Fidei* but we must trust in the Holy Spirit. If Christ has led someone into our life, then it is for a reason. We may have the words that person needs to hear. People all around us are desperately in need of hope. In this place, we have found that light and that hope in the person of Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. From this place, we must burst forth like beams of light carrying that good news to everyone we meet so that they can share our joy.
